



# Part 1

## **TEST FORMAT**








In this part, you will learn about the length and structure of the test. You will also learn about computer adaptive testing and how it affects your test experience.

## **Test Length**

You will need about one hour of uninterrupted time to take the Duolingo English Test.

#### **Test Structure**



Once you begin the test, you will be guided through three stages:

#### Section 1: Introduction and onboarding ~5 minutes

You will complete a tech check (to confirm your computer's camera, speakers, and microphone are working properly), submit your ID, and review the test rules and requirements.

#### Section 2: Adaptive test ~45 minutes

Unlike other tests, the Duolingo English Test is not divided into distinct sections, each assessing a different skill. You will answer a series of different question types that assess all four language skills i.e. speaking, writing, reading and listening, in this section of the test (see the table below for the sequence of questions). The difficulty level of many of the questions will change based on your performance.

#### Section 3: Writing Sample and Speaking Sample ~10 minutes

In the final section of the test, you will be given a question (one each for speaking and writing), that you must respond to at length. Institutions that receive your results will also receive your responses to these two questions, as samples of your English writing and speaking abilities.

#### **About Adaptive Testing**


The Duolingo English Test is a computer adaptive test. This means the difficulty of many of the listening and reading questions changes based on your performance in the test. If you answer a question incorrectly, the next one will be easier. If you answer a question correctly, the next one will be more difficult. An Al engine grades the answers, and adapting questions in this way to match your individual skill level creates a more efficient test experience, as the test ends when the Al engine is confident in your score. So, if some questions seem easier or harder than others, not to worry - that is normal! Another feature of adaptive testing is the large question bank, which means that no matter how many times you take the test you are unlikely to encounter the same question twice. This ensures a secure and unique test experience for every test taker.





# Part 2

## **QUESTION TYPES**







In this part, you will learn about the different types of questions on the Duolingo English Test. There are 14 units, one for each question type.

#### Each unit begins with an **Overview** of the question type, which will show you:

- What the question looks like on the test
- ✓ How much time you have to prepare and/or respond
- ✓ How many times this question type appears in the test and when
- Whether or not the question selection is adaptive
- Which subscores are affected



This is followed by **Scoring**, with a brief explanation of how the question type is scored, and the assessment criteria for the extended speaking and writing questions. For more information about how questions are scored, please look at our Scoring Guide.

# You will also learn some **Tips and Strategies** that will help you answer each question type, including information about:

- The types of images, passages or questions
- The length of passages or minimum word counts for writing, etc.
- How to interact with and respond to the question
- Language learning in relation to this question type
- Using a checklist to help you self-assess (for the extended speaking and writing questions)



Finally, you can **Practice** applying these tips and strategies by completing the exercises that follow, and checking your answers using the **Answer Key**, available at the end of each unit.

In the case of the extended speaking and writing questions, you can listen to/read a few **Sample Answers**, along with an analysis of the response and the DET score range that it fits.

Remember, there are more questions for practice in the Sample Questions book. You can also take the 30-minute practice test for free, as many times as you like, on the Duolingo English Test website.



# **Understanding The Rules**



### Requirements

- Valid ID: You must present your physical ID. Photocopies and digital images are not accepted.
  - For India: passport only.
  - For China: passport or government photo ID.
  - For others: check which IDs are accepted in your country by logging on to englishtest.duolingo.com/ids.
- Computer or laptop with a front-facing camera, microphone, and speakers:
  - If your computer doesn't have an inbuilt camera, you can use a USB camera.
  - · Stay in full screen mode.
  - Keep your mouse cursor within the test window at all times.
  - · Disconnect secondary monitors.
  - Use only one keyboard and one mouse. You may use an external keyboard and/or mouse, but you may not switch between multiple keyboards and/or mice.
- Secondary phone camera:
  - You will need to use your smartphone camera to record your keyboard and computer screen during the test.
  - The phone should be fully charged or plugged into a charger throughout the test.
  - Turn on Do Not Disturb and make sure none of your contacts are set to bypass Do Not Disturb.
  - Lean your phone against any heavy object to the left or right of your computer. Placing the phone horizontally will be most stable.
- Stable internet connection:
  - We recommend using a wired internet connection instead of Wi-Fi.
  - Your internet connection should be stable during the test.
- Quiet, private, and well-lit room:
  - You must be alone in the room and have no interruptions or disturbances.

#### What to avoid

- Do not look away from the screen:
  - However, you may look down at your keyboard to type answers during writing questions.
- No not get any external assistance. This includes:
  - Any software, programs or browser extensions on your computer.
     Tip: Restart your computer and quit all applications before you start.
  - Dictionaries, translators or other devices.
- · Seeking help or assistance from someone else.
- Do not cover your face, ears or mouth:
  - · Your face should be well-lit, and within the camera frame.
  - · Do not wear headphones or earbuds.
  - Keep your ears, eyes, and mouth visible and uncovered throughout the test
  - Do not speak until instructed to speak.
- Do not memorize answers from other sources:
  - Your answers should relate to the questions and be in your own words.
  - Do not save or record test questions.
- Do not take notes.
  - Keep your non-required phones, and other devices (tablets, smart watches, etc.) along with notepads and any other writing materials away from you.
- Do not sign up for multiple accounts to take the test
  - Results from secondary accounts will not be certified.



## **Test Policies**

- You have 21 days to take the test after purchasing.

  If you purchase a 2-test bundle, you have an additional 21 days after you receive a result for the first test to take the second test.
- You may purchase up to 3 tests in any 30 day period.

## Consequences of breaking the rules

If you break any of the rules of the Duolingo English Test, Duolingo reserves the right to not certify your test results, or to invalidate any previously certified results, without providing a refund. Depending on the extent of the violation, you may also be permanently banned from taking the Duolingo English Test again.


